	<p><u>Public Session.</u></p> <p><u>Cllr Wayman report</u> Cllr Wayman raised her concerns of the works at Stonehenge and the closure of the A360 and how Wylve may be affected. She also raised the issue of the construction of the new tunnel. Cllr Wayman confirmed that villages on the B3089 were very concerned about the potential impact on them and asked how Wylve may be affected. When the tunnel comes into place there will be 2 lanes of traffic filtering into 1. So therefore, a potential increase in traffic queues, volumes of traffic and noise increase for Wylve. Cllr Wayman will continue to keep the PC regularly updated and happy to feedback our Parishes concerns. Cllr Shuldham asked if Cllr Wayman could follow up the 20-mph new speed limit implementation with Wiltshire Council. Cllr Wayman confirmed she is no longer the lead of Highways but more than happy to still assist with any matters on or behalf.</p>
