	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Public Session</u></p> <p>3 members of public were present.</p> <p>Mr John Haviland suggested that the PC give gratitude to the Wiltshire Council for the implementation of the 20mph, he also asked if it was possible to have more 20mph signage throughout the village as he feels that the new speed limit is not being adhered to and there is not enough signage. The chair explained that is it not a simple task to do this and the 20mph signs replaced where the 30mph signs were previously.</p> <p>Cllr Wayman agreed she would look into the option of extra signage with Wiltshire Council of 20mph throughout the village and confirm what the process may be.</p> <p>A suggestion was made to have Speed Indicator Devices (SID's) installed on the 3 entry points into Wylye, it was asked how much would they cost? As there are lots of different options that can be purchased it was agreed to look into more detail how much these could potentially cost. The Clerk explained that Steeple Langford are currently also looking at SIDs and so therefore may be able to use their costings.</p>	Clerk

This will have some affect and ultimately result to a reduction of repairs.</p> <p>Fly tipping has had a 22% reduction since Covid 19.</p> <p>Blue bin contamination continues.</p>

	<p>Community area board grants capital reduced by 50% but a similar amount for local highways and improvements group towards highways or footpaths improvements has been allocated</p> <p>There will be an increase in parking charges of 10p per hour across all car parks in Wiltshire.</p> <p>Cllr Wayman confirmed that the rubbish issue on the slip road is Wiltshire Councils authority not highways as originally thought.</p> <p>She also confirmed the clearing on the A303, A36 slipways is imminent, Cllr KH has had confirmation of this.</p> <p>Cllr KH asked Cllr Wayman about the fly tipping at Grovely Woods area that is repetitive, Cllr KH is trying to find out the process that Wiltshire Council follow, Cllr Wayman confirmed that it is the Wiltshire Council that are the prosecutors for this offence.</p> <p>The Chair addressed the issue of the A36 road re surfacing, the maintenance vehicles from English Highways are leaving litter in Deptford. It was suggested could they not use the layby beyond the Langfords as there are toilet facilities there and not use Deptford as a meeting place.</p> <p>Cllr MS to write to Highways with regards to this.</p> <p>Cllr MS asked Cllr Wayman to thank Wiltshire Council for the slip roads clearance/cut back of hedges that has been completed.</p>	MS
